OHSA: PROMULGATION OF MAJOR HAZARD INSTALLATION REGULATIONS, 2022

Hi there

The Minister of Employment and Labour has, under section 43(1)(c) of the Occupational Health and Safety Act 85 of 1993, promulgated the new regulations relating to Major Hazard Installations. The new Regulations will repeal the Major Hazard Installation Regulations, 2001, which was published in Government Notice R. 692, of 30 July 2001. The new Regulations will come into operation on a date determined by the Minister by notice in the Government Gazette.

More information:

The abovementioned regulations will apply to -

- (a) major hazard installations;
- (b) establishments with the prescribed quantity of substances listed in Chapter 1 or 2 of the Regulations; and
- (c) major pipeline establishments (according to Chapter 3 of the Regulations).

Establishments means a major hazard installation under the control of a duty holder where chapter 1, 2, or 3 dangerous substances are present. The Regulations do not apply to nuclear installations registered in terms of the Nuclear Energy Act 131 of 1993.

Regulation 24 Offences and penalties - duty holder who contravenes any of the provisions of these Regulations commits an offence and is, on conviction, liable to a fine not exceeding R5 000 000 or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding 24 months.
